### School Bank

Basic High School's bank is open for business from 6:45 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. See hours posted on bank window for lunch and temporary closures. The bank takes care of all school fees, fines, and student funds. The banker no longer accepts checks. Please remit all payments with cash or money order.

### Buy Your Stuff Online

Our online student store allows you to easily purchase all of your school items online. Pay for all of your items directly from the convenience of your computer so you don't have to stand in line! Once you've completed your transaction, you'll receive a confirmation email that you'll want to keep with you and bring with you to pick up your items. Go online at <http://www.basichighschool.com>.

### Student Planners

All students attending Basic High School must use the school-designed planner. The cost of the planner is \$5.00. Students will receive their planners once they have paid for them at the school bank.

### Visiting Procedures

We encourage parents who want to sit in their child's classroom. However, you must call the Counselors' secretary 24 hours in advance to set up such a visit. Also, for the safety of our students and staff, all visitors must sign in at the reception desk in order to receive a visitor's pass each and every time they visit our school.

Current students that remain at the same school, have the same home address, and are receiving transportation will automatically be registered for transportation for the following school year. Annual registration is no longer required.

### Parents, ParentLink® needs your e-mail address!

For those who have logged in to ParentLink®, we encourage you to check your account information from the MY ACCOUNT link in the top right corner of the screen to make sure that your information is up-to-date and your most current e-mail address is stored in ParentLink®. If you need to update information such as an old address or phone number, this information must be completed at your child's school.

Providing your e-mail address in ParentLink® enables you to reset your password if it is ever lost or forgotten, receive e-mail messages from your school, and subscribe to other important ParentLink® communications. To add an e-mail address, simply log in to ParentLink®, and click on MY ACCOUNT in the top right corner. Under Delivery Addresses click the ADD button and select Email Address. Then click SAVE to save your address once it is entered on the Add Email Address page. Don't delay, set up your email address today!

# DEANS' DEN

## Dress Code Policy for 2011-2012

The Basic High School dress code is in accordance with the CCSD Regulation 5131 and the specific needs of Basic High School. **All dress code is at Administrative discretion.** The specific requirements and prohibitions are:

- Crop tops, strapless tops, low-cut clothing or transparent/translucent clothing, sagging clothing, clothing with slits, holes, and/or tops and outfits that provide minimum coverage are prohibited. **(There should be no skin showing between the bottom of shirt/blouse and the top of pants or skirts.)**
- No spaghetti straps or tank tops permitted; all shirts must cover the entire shoulder. **Cleavage should NOT show.**
- The hemline of all shorts, skirts and dresses are to be **at or below fingertip length, even while seated in a sitting position.** **All dress code is at Administrative discretion.** Although fashionable clothing may be purchased with holes, there should be no skin showing in areas that are above the knee.
- All jeans, pants, and trousers must be secured at waist level. **Sagging is strictly prohibited.** Jeans, pants, and trousers are not to have rips or tears that expose undergarments or shorts, and/or are located mid-thigh or higher.
- All shorts and pants must be hemmed and without fraying.
- All headgear is prohibited on campus with the exception of those worn as part of a designated school approved uniform, or at an authorized athletic practice or activity. This includes hats, bandanas, sweatbands, or headbands, and sunglasses, unless authorized by a physician.
- Clothing containing slogans or advertising, which by their controversial or obscene nature, disrupt the educational setting are strictly prohibited. This includes clothing that advertises illegal activities or drinking and/or drug use.
- NO spiked or studded clothing.
- NO bedroom slippers.
- NO pajama pants.
- Visible jewelry, studs, and other similar items, which are attached by body piercing to areas other than the ears, are prohibited. Small, discrete facial piercings are allowed; however, **all dress code is at Administrative discretion.**
- Wearing additional clothing, such as a jacket to cover an item that is a violation of Basic High School's dress code policy is prohibited. Additionally, this pertains to the wearing of leggings under skirts or shorts that are too short, or under jeans with holes in them. **Wearing an article of clothing that violates the dress code policy, is subject to discipline.**

Students found in violation of the dress code policy will be given school appropriate clothing to change into. Students will sign for the clothing and be given a receipt indicating such. The student is responsible for returning the item/s at the end of the school day. If the school appropriate clothing is not returned, students will be charged a fee for the item they have been given. This fee will be added to the student's school account with the school banker, and will require a receipt or payment to be cleared.

## The Dr. Joel and Carol Bower School-Based Health Center Available at Basic HS

The Dr. Joel and Carol Bower School-Based Health Center (SBHC) is located in a portable building in the student parking lot. Funding for the portable was made available through a grant from the Trust Fund for Public Health of the State of Nevada.

The SBHC opened in September 2004 and offers direct healthcare services to all children attending Basic HS and other Henderson schools. In addition to promoting health and wellness for the many diverse students in Henderson, many of whom have no access to health care, the SBHC helps decrease student absenteeism during the operation of school. The SBHC provides acute medical services, such as health screenings, immunizations, as well as treatment for asthma, colds, flu, ear infections, headaches, and migraines. Referrals by a nurse and nurse practitioners staffed by Nevada State College are made for conditions requiring treatment by a specialist, such as high blood pressure, high cholesterol, heart murmurs, diabetes, and vision and dental problems. Sports physicals cost \$20.00 and are to be pre-paid at the school bank.

If you wish to have your student use these health services provided by the SBHC, please read the information your child brings home on the first day of school, complete the permission forms and your student's health history, and have your student return them to his/her second period teacher. You need not be present for your child to receive services if you have given permission.

Please call 799-0508 for the days and hours the health center is open.

## Items Prohibited at School

No radios, TV's, tape recorders, beepers, skateboards, roller skates, roller blades, water pistols, Walkman-type radios/cassettes/CD's, MP 3 players, iPods, chains (including wallet chains), mace, spiked leather necklaces/bracelets, sunglasses, permanent markers, or toys are permitted on campus. Any other items not listed will be at the discretion of school personnel to decide if they are nuisance items. Since these items should not be on campus, the school **will NOT be held responsible if they are lost or stolen, nor will the school be responsible for the recovery of lost or stolen items.**

### CELL PHONES

- Phones must be tuned OFF and remain OFF during the instructional day and passing periods in compliance with CCSD Policy 5136.
- Cell phones may ONLY be used before school, during lunch in the quad area, and after school.
- Cell phones should be stored in a non-visible location (backpack, purse, pockets) at all times.
- As a condition of possessing a device on campus, the student agrees to a search of the device's content if reasonable suspicion of violating the cell phone use policy exists.
- Phones confiscated in violation of these guidelines will be returned to a parent/guardian during **non-instructional hours only.**

All school guidelines, including those listed here for Dress Code and Items Prohibited at School, are listed in the 2011-2012 Basic High School Student Handbook and Agenda which each student is required to purchase at the beginning of the school year. ## Bullying, Cyberbullying, Harassment, and /or Intimidation ARE PROHIBITED IN PUBLIC SCHOOL

What are Harassment and/or Intimidation – including Bullying and/or Cyberbullying? These actions include, but are not limited to the following:

- Unwanted touching
- Threats
- Epithets
- Graphic comments about one's body
- Unwelcome sexual advances
- Blocking a person's normal movements
- Slurs
- Verbal propositions
- Unwelcome jokes
- Any act of retaliation

*Cyberbullying is bullying, harassment, and/or intimidation through the use of electronic communication*

### Where do I go if I need help?

Any student who feels that he/she is a victim of any type of harassment or intimidation, should immediately report the incident to:

- A Teacher
- A School Administrator or
- A Counselor
- Any Adult

If a teacher, staff member, or administrator is part of the harassment, the student and/ or parent/guardian should report the incident to the Area/Division Associate Superintendent.

### What are the consequences for harassment and/ or intimidation, including bullying and cyberbullying?

Any retaliatory behavior against any student who reports an incident or anyone who participates in the harassment complaint process is prohibited.

**Students:** May result in suspension/expulsion, as in accordance with the existing disciplinary procedures.

**Staff:** May result in disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

### What will schools do to help protect students?

Appropriate actions will be taken by the school administrator to reinforce the Clark County School District Policy 5137 Safe and Respectful Learning Environment, the Clark County School District Regulation 5141.1 Discipline: Control of Dangerous and Antisocial Behavior and Regulation 5141.2 Discipline: Harassment. These actions include but are not limited to the following:

- Removing vulgar or offensive graffiti, pictures, or objects
- Provide staff in-service on the regulations
- Proper notification to students
- Conduct investigations into the allegation
- Refer the incident to the school police, if appropriate
- Take immediate and appropriate disciplinary or remedial action as needed
- Take appropriate follow-up actions in an attempt to ensure there are no further incidents or retaliation

## Basic to Dedicate Track on October 6th

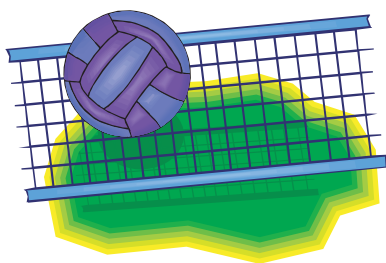


The Basic High School track will be named for long time cross country and track coach Larry Burgess at a dedication ceremony during halftime of the Oct. 6<sup>th</sup> football game against Liberty HS. Coach Burgess taught and coached at Basic from 1978 until his retirement in 2004. Under Burgess' tutelage the Basic boy captured five Nevada State team cross country championships, 3 state runner-up trophies and 10 region titles. The girls program posted 2 state runner-up trophies and won 5 region titles.

Among many other awards he was named the Southern Nevada 4A Cross Country Coach of the Year 8 times, was the Region 7 National Track and Field Coach of the Year and was named the National Cross Country Coach of the Year by the National High School Coaches Association 2 times and was inducted into the NIAA Hall of Fame after his retirement in 2004.

**LOCKERS**

All students must complete a locker application and contract. Valuables are not to be placed in lockers, as the school assumes no responsibility for the loss of items from lockers. Lockers are to be kept neat and free of graffiti. Stickers are not to be placed on lockers. School lockers remain the property of the school, and the school authorities have a right to examine the contents of those lockers for reasons of health, safety, and security, without notice.

**PASSES**

Students who leave the classroom or are excused from class must use the hall pass section in the back of their agenda or must have a valid pass in his/her possession. Students without a valid pass will be referred to the Deans' Office. A valid pass includes the student's name, signature of person issuing pass, the time, date, and destination. Students will not be issued a pass during 5<sup>th</sup> hour.

**VALUABLES/LOST AND FOUND**

Student valuables or large amounts of money are not to be brought to school. The school assumes no responsibility for the loss or theft of such valuables or any lost articles. The "Lost and Found" is located in the main office near the Individualized Program's Facilitator's Office.

**PHONE MESSAGES/USE OF PHONES**

No phone messages will be taken to students. If an emergency situation arises, parents may feel free to come to the school to see their child. Office telephones are for business use only and may be used by students with permission only in case of emergency.

**STUDENT PARKING**

Student parking is limited to the north lot. Any student parking in the teacher parking lot or on Dooley will be subject to ticketing. Students are not permitted to park in the church parking lot. Students that park in the church parking lot without authorization may be towed. Students are not to loiter in the parking lot or in their cars during class time, between classes or during lunch break. Students' cars may be searched if there is suspicion of alcohol, drugs, stolen items, or as part of an arrest for violating the law. Surveillance cameras are present in the student parking lot. Students must register their car in the deans' office and place a parking decal on the bumper. Clark County School District Regulations require students that park on campus to have auto insurance, and proof of insurance will be required.

**MAESTAS ACTIVITY CENTER / CAFETERIA**

BHS is a closed campus. The cafeteria provides students with a breakfast menu and hot lunches during the school day. Breakfast is served before school and must be consumed in the student activity center or quad. Food is not to be taken out of these areas. Students are to dispose of their own garbage in the designated receptacles after they are through with their meal.

Free and reduced price meals are available at our school cafeteria for eligible students. In order to qualify for the National School Lunch and Breakfast Program, a federally subsidized program, students may pick up an application from the cafeteria manager. Once filled out, the application should be returned to her in order for eligibility to be determined.

**STUDENT FINES**

Students must pay all fines prior to participating in school activities. Call Lila the banker at 799-8000 ext. 4044 to see if your child has a fine.
